CONGRESSMAN JARED POLIS ON THE HIDDEN GEMS

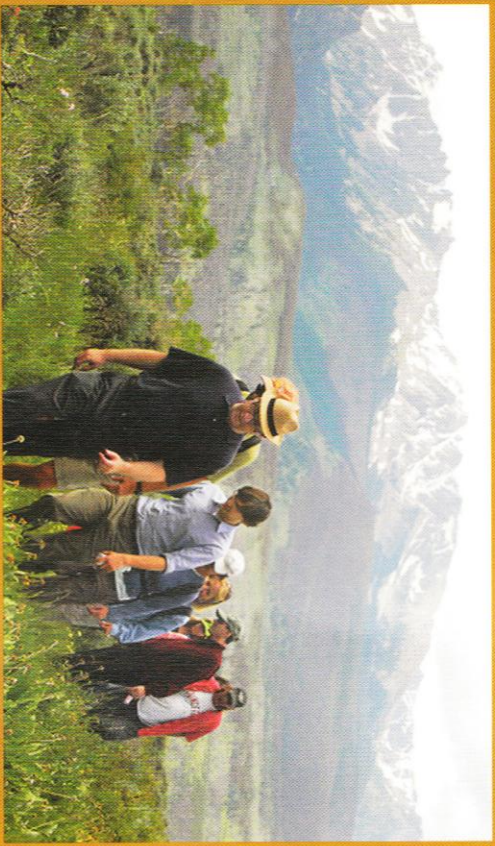


Congressman Polis was recently given a formal recommendation for new wilderness areas in the White River National Forest within Summit and Eagle Counties. Managing our land wisely is important for the economy and the many jobs that rely on our unique landscapes. Congressman Polis believes that decisions about how we use our public lands are critical to our future, and that everyone should have a say.

That's why Congressman Polis is undertaking an extensive public review process throughout the area to get your feedback, including numerous public hearings, office hours and the attached mail-back survey.

What Is the Hidden Gems Wilderness Proposal?

This proposal would add a number of new Forest Service areas to the National Wilderness Preservation System. Wilderness areas ensure important lands remain undeveloped for generations to come. Wilderness areas prohibit things like oil and gas leasing, permanent structures and new roads, and are a refuge for activities our economy relies on like fishing, hunting, hiking and camping. Other popular activities like mountain biking and motorized recreation are restricted in wilderness, but the specific boundaries should leave most mountain biking trails and motorized recreation areas unaffected and compromises are being developed as well.

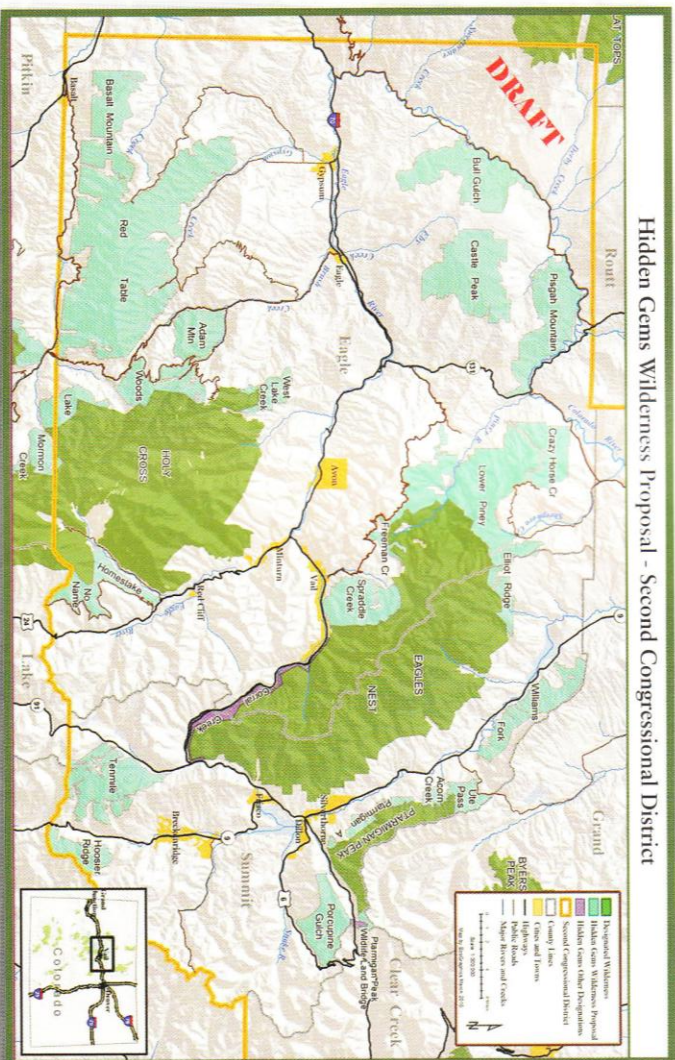


Congressman Jared Polis speaks to constituents about the Hidden Gems wilderness proposal during a hike through the area.

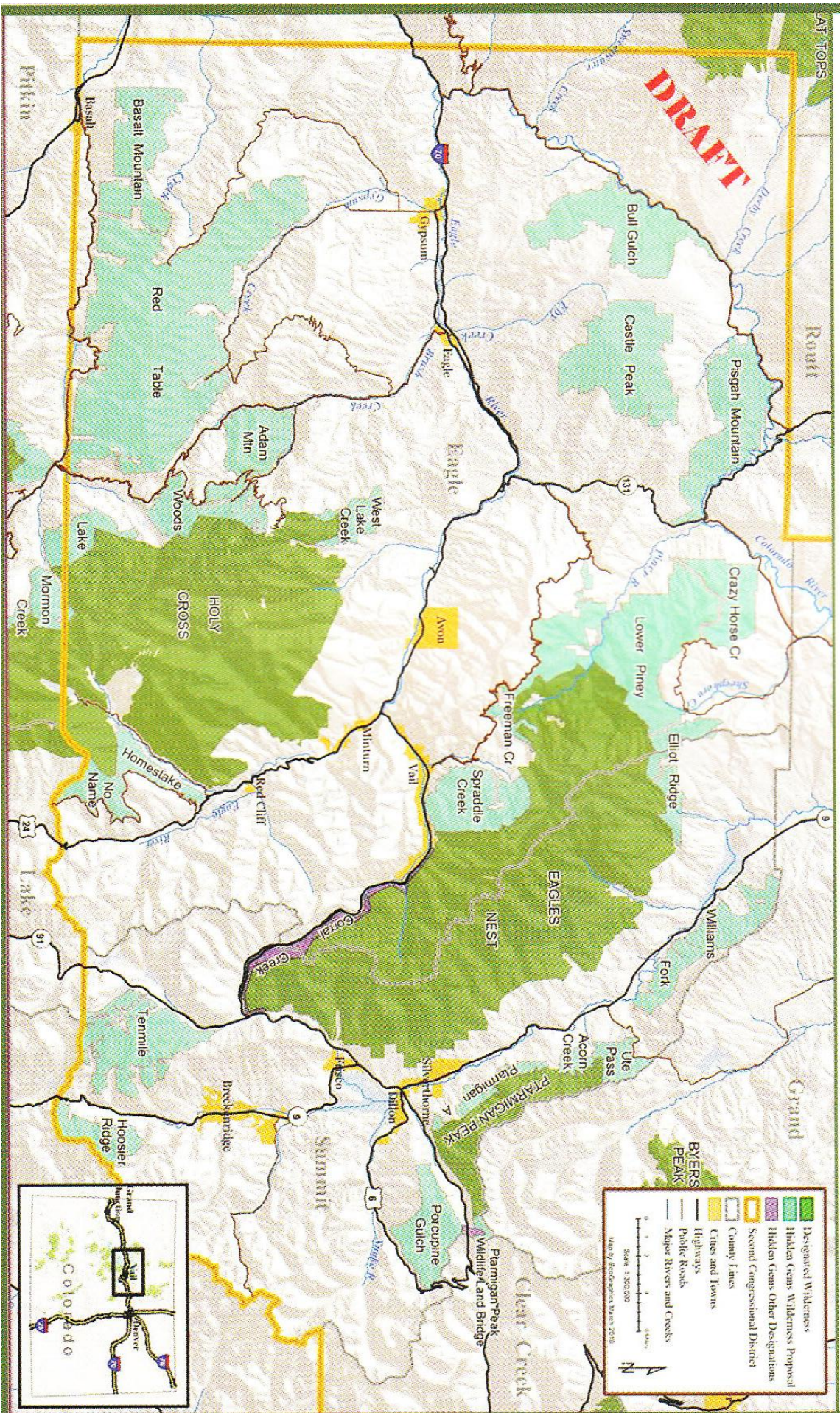
What Areas Are Under Consideration?

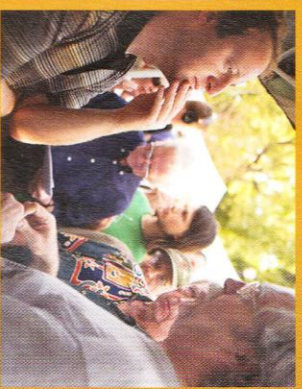
